### What we have done so far

DISCOVER has come a long way since it was launched in Birmingham last year (2012). Our partners are working hard on finding the best ICT solutions to support people in their caring roles. We are developing on-line carers' resources to connect carers to the most appropriate services to match their particular needs, to provide instant access to online supports through the carers' discussion forum and through our dedicated carers' learning zone. Over the past six months we have been exploring and testing how best to deliver these supports on mobile devices such as iPhones and iPads as well as through internet services, digital televisions and many more besides. Our goal is to facilitate carers to experience the smart service that DISCOVER provides, with every carers need for information as unique and individualised as they are. We will begin testing of the DISCOVER service in a number of European countries. We will keep you up-to-date on how this is going through in the summer edition of our newsletter and with video clips from each of the countries and we hope you will contribute to developments. ## The technologies we are using

DISCOVER provides a virtual learning environment with interactive support that offers opportunities for the delivery of health and well-being education to match the individual needs of carers. At its most basic it can be used to connect carers to educational eresources, such as text articles and book lists, tailored to support the individual learning needs of carers whether this involves supporting carers who wish to embark on a period of formal study or just to help carers to make informed choices about the needs of a vulnerable person. Then there is the option to engage in more lively, hands-on learning, designed to foster greater understanding through:

- our on-line carers discussion board to stimulate chat and foster a sense of community among carers to share ideas and learn from each other
- by developing collaborations between carer, care organisations, policymakers and the general public
- by helping carers get the best from the internet
- by providing facilities to uploading documents and working collaboratively with carers and services providers to encourage shared learning
- through on-line quizzes to gauge knowledge and level of understanding

The e-format used by DISCOVER allows carers to access support at a time and place of their choosing. Our online signposting to services also provide carers with the opportunity to learn about information sources at their own pace and when they need it most.
